Many thanks for your submissions to the Community Highways Improvement Programme (CHIP).

There were 34 expressions of interest submitted from across the South East Cornwall CAP and the Cornwall Councillors have undertaken the initial assessment, agreeing that 24 schemes should progress to the next stage of the programme, which will entail more detailed design/costings.

The two expressions of interest submitted from St Keyne & Trewidland PC were included in the assessment and it was agreed that whilst both schemes were eligible, it would be beneficial to understand which is the priority for the parish council. Can you therefore advise whether the parking restriction at Trewidland or the speed reduction at the entrance to St Keyne is the scheme you would prioritise?

The next (and final) review of the 24 schemes is due to take place on 23rd June so your insight before then would be appreciated.
